
THE



COURSES

This art and design workshop course has been created with teenagers that are looking to get the full experience of art school in mind. Whether you consider yourself a complete beginner or if you are already studying art and design at school, this course will give you the experience of learning at Central Saint Martins.

You will learn new skills while developing your confidence through experimentation, idea generation and creativity enhancing activities whilst on this residential course. There is also a focus on building upon your technical skills through practical assignments that include making and designing.



During the two weeks you will explore the following subjects, all supported by the relevant talks and discussions:

- Observational Drawing
- Still Life
- Mark-Making
- Printmaking
- Painting
- Colour and Collage
- Typography
- Graphic Design
- Sculpture
- Spatial Design
- Model Making

Towards the end of the course you will take these techniques and apply them to a personal project of your choosing with guidance from your tutor. All students will complete the course with sketchbooks full of ideas, along with a number of finished works and new technical abilities, all of which will help inspire your art and design practice in the future.

This course has been designed specifically for teenagers that are interested in studying fashion design and styling. Whether you consider yourself a complete beginner or if you are studying art, design or fashion at school, this course will give you an experience of fashion as it is taught at Central Saint Martins.

You will develop your confidence while experimenting with design, working on idea generation and focusing on creativity while also developing your technical skills through tutor-led practical making and designing activities.



During this 2 week course you will explore the following subjects, all supported by the relevant talks and discussions:

- Fashion illustration
- Observational drawing and mark-making skills
- 3D skills, such as draping and experimenting with textile and styling techniques
- How to develop an idea from research through experimentation to a final design outcome
- Creating a fashion film; fashion styling, modelling, hair and makeup, art direction and filming & lighting

You can expect to explore the design process very much in the spirit of the college, where your own personal and explorative approach will be celebrated and encouraged.

Central Saint Martins is internationally famous for fashion design, with alumni including Stella McCartney, Alexander McQueen, Matthew Williamson and John Galliano.

TRAVEL

UK VISAS AND IMMIGRATION

It is very important that you have the correct visa for your Residential Summer Course as you will not be allowed on the programme without the right visa. It is your responsibility to check your visa status and ensure you obtain the correct visa for your course.

Students do not need a visa if they are travelling to the UK on a passport issued by a country within the European Union (EU), European Economic Area (EEA – Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway) or Switzerland.

If you are from a country outside the EU/EEA, you should check if you can enter the UK without applying for a visa before you travel to the UK on this web page: www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa/y. If you need to apply, you should apply for a 'Short-term Study visa' (if you are under age 16, then you will automatically obtain a 'Short-term Study visa (child)').

If you do not need to apply for a visa before you travel to the UK, you should print the 'Short-term Study visa' letter we sent you after you booked your course and carry it in your hand luggage. Show it to the Immigration Officer at the UK border when you arrive to enter as a Short-term student.

Important: If you're under 18 and you are travelling alone or with someone who isn't your parent or guardian you will need to provide additional documents.



PACKING GUIDE: VALUABLES AND ESSENTIALS

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MONEY AND VALUABLES

We advise students to leave passports in the secure safe that is provided on site. It is your responsibility to take care of your own valuables which should be kept locked in your room. All students will have their own cupboard in their room that can be locked. We cannot take responsibility for loss or theft of valuables.

ESSENTIALS

- Money and a Debit Card (a suggested budget of £200 should be adequate for the two week stay)
- Any medicine belonging to a student must be given to a member of staff on arrival for safe keeping. Medicines can be accessed by the students at designated times with a member of Find Education staff. Any medication that is required should be clearly labelled with a dosage and number of times to be administered.

If a student becomes unwell and needs medication, the house staff will take them to a pharmacy and the pharmacist will tell them the best medication. Once prescribed the student will contact their parent to inform them and Find Education will check their medical records. Once the parent has agreed the student can take the medication.

- Bath towels (towels are not provided)
- Laundry bag
- Passport (and Visa documents) if you are coming from outside the UK

- Adaptor plugs compatible with (UK British electricity supply works on 240 Volts or 50 Hertz)
- Camera and USB cable plus charger
- Mobile phone (including charger)

ESSENTIALS AND SUGGESTIONS:

If you are not from the UK, it's important to know that the summer in England can be hot or cool, rainy or dry. It's important that you are prepared for any weather!

INSURANCE

All students will be required to have their own insurance policy in place for the duration of the course.


LOCATIONS


Most meals during the programme will be served at this location.




CENTRAL SAINT MARTINS GRANARY SQUARE

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Students will also visit the main campus of CSM during the residential course. They will have access with their class to the library and studio spaces and will have a customised tour of the facilities. While working at this building students will be using the same facilities as our full-time students.



PROCEDURES



We expect you to bring to your studies at the Summer School the highest level of commitment and that you will do your best to make good use of your time. You will be expected to attend all classes and activities for which you have signed up.

Our aim is to instill a friendly, lively, productive and enjoyable atmosphere on the school campus, in which everyone is safe and feels comfortable and respected. While formal rules will be kept to a minimum, it must be clearly understood that high standards of behaviour will always be expected.

Physical violence, or the threat of violence, must never be used.

Theft of any kind will be regarded as a serious offence.

Racial or sexual harassment, or bullying of any kind, will not be tolerated.

Serious breaches of the rules may lead to your removal from the Summer School.

We do not allow the drinking of alcohol as it is illegal for under 18's to drink alcohol in the UK.

In England it is illegal for under 18's to buy cigarettes. Smoking / vaping is not permitted on our residential sites.

The use of any drug is strictly prohibited. If you are prescribed drugs for a medical issue these must be handed over to Find Education staff and they will be dispensed under supervision.

All students must attend all meals and excursions.

Damage to property and firefighting equipment will not be tolerated. Students who are found causing damage will be charged.

Students are not permitted to enter 'out of bounds' areas – all of these areas will have clearly visible signs.

Students are not allowed off campus at any time without permission and should not leave the accommodation block at night. Under no circumstances should students leave the college campus without supervision.

WE EXPECT

RESPECT

Students must treat all staff, members of the public and each other with respect at all times.

SPEAK ENGLISH

Students are expected to try and speak English at all times whether talking to people of the same or different nationalities.

NO BULLYING

Bullying is the deliberate and / or repeated action of making another person unhappy. Bullying of any nature will not be tolerated and may result in students being sent home at their own expense.

INTEGRATION

Students are expected to try and integrate with all of the different nationalities and ethnic backgrounds that we have at our centres. Students are also actively encouraged to try and learn as much as possible about the different countries that other students come from.

BEDTIME

All students are expected to be in their rooms by 10:30pm after evening entertainment and to have lights out and be quiet by 11pm.

ARRIVAL
